



2.0 Safety Policy Statement

IMR are committed to performing all work practices to the standards set out in the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act, 2005, the SHWW Act (General Application) Regulation 2007, all relevant regulation, codes of practice and guidelines.

IMR view the management of Health and Safety as a prime responsibility of line management from the Managing Director to first line supervisors. - Provision and dissemination to management and employees the necessary instruction, training, information, supervision and encouragement to perform their duties to the utmost of their ability, fostering an environment of ongoing Safety and Health.
- Act on any health or safety problem reported to the designated Safety official.
- Commit to providing the necessary funding for resources required to maintain a safe workplace and associated activities.
